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TARGET AUDIENCE: Operations Flight

Defense Logistics Agency Maintenance, Repair, And Operations (MRO) Services Program

SYNOPSIS:

The Defense Logistics Agency's (DLA) Defense Supply Center, Philadelphia (DSCP) has recently offered a Maintenance, Repair, and Operations (MRO) Services program to Air Force customers. This program provides DoD and other federal agency customers a full range of competitively priced maintenance, repair, and operations services, as quickly as possible and on an as-needed basis. Work includes such items as building repairs, painting, heating, roofing, plumbing, paving, and snow removal, just to name a few. Work does not include Architect-Engineer services or jobs requiring MILCON funding.

At the present time, only Andrews AFB, Bolling AFB, Dover AFB, the District of Columbia Air National Guard, and Otis ANGB are using the program. Their points of contact report that the program supports requirements very well. DSCP intends to implement this program in the Air Force within the contiguous United States a region at a time. The only region being supported at present is the Northeast Region. The chart to the right shows the expected implementation schedule.

EXPECTED PROGRAM BENEFITS:

Expected benefits to base-level customers include a wide variety of services, freedom from long-term commitments, fast response, reduced lead time, increased flexibility and capacity, and reduction in cost. Benefits to the Air Force include the ability to provide emergency support, supplement capacity as needed, and provide specialty services.

Work is accomplished via individual firm, fixed-price contracts on an Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity basis. That means that for each requirement a Statement of Work must be written and forwarded to DSCP to determine the scope of the job and to ensure that competition is handled appropriately. It also means the projects can be funded quickly as money becomes available to support requirements.

Since DLA has already met Federal Acquisition Regulation and Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation requirements and the contracts are handled by DLA, bases are able to get work accomplished simply by turning requirements and funding over to DLA.

DSCP currently has four contractors that compete for each job. Three are large businesses (DynCorp Technical Services, Day & Zimmerman Services, and Elliot Lewis Corp) and one small business contractor (Universe Technologies). Competition for jobs is fierce as each contractor is expected to bid jobs over \$2,500. Bases are encouraged to capitalize on this opportunity as it becomes available in their respective areas.
