Full Spectrum Threat Response (FSTR) Web Site Now on the AF Portal

SYNOPSIS:

The FSTR Web site has transitioned from the HQ AFCESA Web site to the Air Force Portal.

What Is This AF Portal?

The Air Force Portal (AFP) is the enterprise solution for providing information and tools to the warfighter. It is the one-stop shop for Air Force information.

For a quick overview of the AFP, go to <https://portal.af.mil/> where you can view a short video clip of General John P. Jumper's (CSAF) vision of the AFP as well as a tutorial and other AFP information.

How Do I Gain Access to the AF Portal?

On 3 December 2003, the CSAF and SECAF issued a memo requiring that all Air Force employees (active duty, Guard, Reserve, civilian and contractor) obtain an AFP Username by April 2004.

To obtain an AFP Username, log on to <https://www.my.af.mil>, scroll down and click the "Self-Registration" link to obtain your AFP credentials. You will be sent two emails: one containing your Username and one containing your initial password. You must then log on to the AFP, change your password, and complete the registration process.

To access the FSTR area, log on to the AFP, click the "My Workspace" tab, and then click "Readiness" in the left navigation pane.



But Wait...There's More!

We also have Civil Engineer and FSTR Communities of Interest (COI). These areas of the AFP are used for coordination and collaboration.

The COIs are "members-only" clubs and have role-based access. To apply for membership in these communities, you must request access from the COI owner by providing your AFP User ID and the reason you need access.

Another AFP feature is the Air Force Instant Messenger (AFIM). Within the AFIM is a link to the AFIM Collaboration Center that provides chat rooms. Three permanent chat rooms can be accessed through the "List of Chat Rooms" link: HQ AFCESA, Full Spectrum Threat Response and CE Readiness. These areas are available for use anytime. Periodically, meetings in these rooms will be announced in the respective COIs. Not only are these tools helpful in day-to-day operations, but you can also create your own temporary or permanent rooms. Control centers, teams, etc., can use these during contingencies.
