Computer-based Prime BEEF Home Station Training, Volume 2


SYNOPSIS:

HQ AFCESA/CEXX recently completed a new computer-based Prime BEEF home station training product on Bare Base Planning. This CD-ROM presents material supporting the Prime BEEF Category I home station training program outlined in Attachment 2 to AFI 10-210, *Prime Base Engineer Emergency Force (BEEF) Program*. AFCESA is making a concerted effort to update all Prime BEEF training products. Our intent is to provide a current video or CD-ROM product for each identified training requirement.

COURSE CONTENT:

This CD-ROM consists of four courses involving Bare Base Planning. These courses will provide sufficient information to effectively plan and site a bare base. It is highly recommended that students review these courses in order, as each course builds on the previous one.

Material is presented in a logical sequence, similar to an actual bare base deployment and buildup. The first course, *Bare Base Conceptual Planning*, describes Joint Chiefs of Staff contingency standards and planning factors and explains the air base planning process and principles. *Specific Planning Guidance* in course two includes engineering force planning factors and employment guidelines and addresses the prioritization of specific tasks. The *Bare Base Equipment and Packaging Course*, course three, identifies Harvest Falcon and Harvest Eagle mobility assets and explains how those assets are packaged and deployed. Course 4, *Bare Base Site Layout*, describes the various factors influencing the layout of bare base functions and assets. This home station training CD is designed to prepare Prime BEEF team members for deployment and help them hit the ground running!
